PROJECT OVERVIEW



CHALLENGE

Climate change and the current refugee crises are two of the most challenging issues affecting people on a global scale. Despite the various efforts made to respond to these imminent topics, there is still no guarantee solution. The need for all of us to contribute to a more environmentally friendly future, regardless of class, socioeconomic background, career, geographical location and educational background is imminent.
